Safe Storage for San Onofre Nuclear Waste 1 2 3 **WHEREAS** the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) waste rule of August 26, 2014 leaves nuclear waste to be stored at the US reactors sites for 60 to 140 years 4 or indefinitely after the reactor is shut down until the Department of Energy takes 5 the fuel to a final repository and that such site is San Onofre Nuclear Generating 6 Station ("SONGS") which was shut down two years ago, and 7 8 WHEREAS, Camp Pendleton military base has become the Interim Storage 9 location for Southern California Edison's (SCE) 1632 tons of spent fuel and 10 Nuclear Waste located near known earthquake faults and a tsunami zone that 11 suffers yearly fire and wind storms dangers, and sits in an ocean environment of 12 salt air corrosion surrounded by a dense population of over 8.4 million people 13 within its 50 mile radius 14 15 NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the California Democratic Party 16 strongly urges the Governor and State Legislators to work with the NRC and other 17 agencies as required to create immediately a licensed interim storage facility or 18 geological repository for California's high level spent fuel and nuclear waste from 19 shut down nuclear reactors in California to a publicly owned inland and 20 environmentally safe location, with a goal to move all spent fuel and nuclear waste 21 by 2019, (and or as soon as is reasonably possible). 22 23 Submitted by Craig J.
